# Principal Report Mark

Mark noted that efforts are being made towards promoting excellent behavior among students at school. Class meetings and planning for structured playground activities are two examples. Principles of Truth, Beauty and Goodness (from Author Howard Gardner) are being integrated in various student activities.

Mark acknowledged his appreciation for parent participation in school activities such as school grounds care and classroom volunteering.

He announced that changes are coming for the WASL; more information to follow.

# **Teacher's Report**

Monica

The Olders have been studying Ancient Egypt in group activities. This theme has been integrated throughout the curriculum.

Parent Ed- Math

Students are encouraged to use multiple strategies to solve problems. Monica demonstrated examples of hands on learning she uses in the classroom. The students are given the opportunity to do ground work and exploration prior to the introduction of principles/algorithms. The goal is true understanding of math principles.

Carol

The Middles are studying crayfish and Bess beetles in their Science module. The Valentines party was a success. The planning and enactment of the party was a cooperative effort between student reps and room moms.

Parent Ed-Math

Students are able to explore groupings in a concrete way to provide a foundation for multiplication.

They study groups of arrays to solidify math facts in multiplication. Arrays are also used for division problems.

## Diane

The Youngers took the city bus successfully on their last Learning Journey to the Kirkland Performance Center. They will be going to the UW greenhouse next week to complement their plant studies. DCS/Sandburg is entering a contest to have a greenhouse donated to the school.

The students are studying the life cycle of plants and are observing the growth of brassica in the classroom. They are also studying animal classification with a takehome journal and classroom puppets.

Parent Ed-Math

The goal of math study is true understanding of concepts.

A major focus in the Youngers is on combinations of ten and doubles. There is a focus on place value also. They use manipulatives and games to explore math facts. Diane also shared some concepts from Howard Gardner's book "5 Minds for the Future". Gardner emphasizes that students should approach each topic in a number of ways, a principle implemented in the Youngers.

## Treasurer's Report/Financial Statement Sara

Sara reported that \$16,305 is DCS's projected income for 2008-09. We have received \$11,880 in donations thus far.

Scholarships for parent contributions are available and are confidential. Sara requested that if a parents wish to receive a scholarship, they should speak with the treasurer as soon as possible.

There is approximately \$16,000 in budgeted expenses, with spending \$4,500 below this level thus far.

Sara presented the need for new walkie-talkies for the instructional aides to use during recess. They are critical during emergencies and new ones would have enhanced communication with emergency services. The current walkie-talkies are outdated. A proposal was made to use money from our excess funds (which now have a balance of roughly \$7,000) to pay for the updated equipment.

A motion was made to use \$ 1,164.95 for new walkie talkies, to be taken out of DCS excess funds.

The motion was seconded and passed.
