## 6:50 30 min Sara/Stella Treasurer's Report

 Budget review and passage for 2009/2010 school year – please see attached budget recommendations from the DCS Steering meeting

## Income:

- Member Contributions: based on 72 students, with 93% contribution rate.
- Corporate Matching: assumed slightly less due to Microsoft layoffs.

## **Expenses:**

## Enrichment (Field Trips, Enrichment (Friday Specials), Science, Art, Class Libraries) represents 41.89% of budget.

Field Trips: based on \$1,500 for field trips, plus \$325 for one bus (in addition to PTSA bus)

#### Community Building represents 29.88% of budget

- Graduation based on a formula with the expected number of students. 3% increase due to cost increases. Includes pizza party, tassels, Ms Engquist's gifts to students, etc.
- Graduating family gifts based on number of families.
- Staff Appreciation: increasing "Instructional Assistant" category to include Specialists and other staff. Adding a breakfast category with \$100.
- Fall, Winter Events and Spring Camp: In the past these have been expected to break even. There was consensus on the Steering that due to combination of economy and our surplus, the school will subsidize these events. Organizers can choose to charge or not charge, with the net cost to DCS being shown in the budget.
- Memory Pages: Including financial hardship assumption

## Other represents 8.25% of budget.

- · Community Service: slight increase
- Mail Server: unknown cost; has been provided by school family
- Grounds Care: Increased for mulch not provided in full by PTSA
- Green Team: In past, has received grant funding.

## Classrooms represent 12.75% of the budget.

Increasing Teacher Continuing Ed

## Board of Directors Expenses represent 7.24% of budget.

Insurance: will look at lower cost options for next year, but assuming similar cost just in case.

## **CONCLUSION:**

- \$16,827 in Income
- \$20,591 in Expenses
- \$3,763.90 shortfall
- Approximately \$22,000 in our bank account as surplus from prior years. Steering wants to keep some cushion, but
  wants to use contributions and surplus wisely to support our children's education.

## **PTSA LIAISON REPORT**

- Outdoor Education fundraising: We made \$275 at the school dance bake sale, and \$1,375 in carnival concessions. The Cookie dough fundraiser totals are still pending, but at last count we'd done about \$4,000 in sales at a 45% profit, that puts us at roughly \$1,800.
- All total we've raised about \$3,450 for outdoor education since March.
- The question was also raised as to whether we had met our goals for the fundraising the truthful answer was we didn't really have a goal. We had not done fundraising for outdoor ed. in several years, so this year was mainly a "let's see what we can raise" kind of year. I think the consensus is that, considering the effort of doing the concessions ourselves, the amount raised was significant enough to continue doing the carnival concessions ourselves as an outdoor ed. fundraiser.
