# 6:32 **TEACHER'S REPORT** presented by Diane

### 6:40 **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT** presented by Mark

All school dance is tomorrow night at 6:45 in Henry David Thoreau Elementary until 8:45. Report cards/conferences this month, which is new, and using some new processes. For example, the Life Skills section has changed (new name and some different definitions). The days of conferences will be half days of school.

The new school building is moving along – have a meeting with the architects tomorrow.

The current building will be getting new internet access points for wi-fi as the new netbooks were found to really tax the current configuration. This will also allow the whole school to do the MSP ( $3^{rd} - 6^{th}$  graders) online.

- My Access (writing program for Monica) is approved, but there are technical issues that are preventing the deployment of this in elementary schools. The math program still needs to go through the vetting by the Instructional Needs Meeting and is on the docket for this month.
- The Stability Balls are on hold right now while the Risk Management group for the district wants to take a look at them due to some studies that state long time usage can cause issues. The decision has come through that these now need to be used for intermittent usage rather than all day long, and this means need to re-evaluate how to meet that usage.

Information about next year's outdoor ed program should be decided by later this month.
