6:30 **WELCOME** presented by Laura

6:35 **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT** presented by Mark

6:47 YOUNGERS TEACHER'S REPORT presented by Diane

- Imagine Children's Museum was the location for the March Learning Journey, which fit in with Balance and Motion the current science theme.
- They are working on reports on important women.

- Studying Diverse Cultural Groups, which is focusing on Chinese-Americans. The work involves literature study, in room presentations on the culture, and will a learning journey to the International District.
- The science module is the physics of sound, with their individual projects coming together next week.

7:03 **OLDERS TEACHER'S REPORT** presented by Monica

- Math is a big piece of the Youngers, and they are moving to Geometry and working on circles right now. Demonstrated
 some of the work the students are expected to accomplish, and some books the kids are reading to tie in thoughts of
 math with an understanding of what it entails.
- A brief description of Islandwood (http://www.islandwood.org), the location of where the 5th graders will be going for their time of Outdoor School.
- Graduation will be 2:00 on Friday 22 June.

7:20 TREASURER'S REPORT presented by Shannon S

- Due to a surprise corporate match we hit that part of our budget, but we are still a couple of thousand behind in income. There are many areas of the budget that will be under in terms of expenses, but do expect many late expenses. The end of the year should still be under budget, and we should finish with about \$5000 to \$6000 in the bank.
- Bank of America accounts are closed out.
- Discussion of budget for 2012 2013 started with a historical reminder of how and why the \$25k surplus that existed a few years ago has been purposely spent. It was noted that income has been on a decline over the last few years (such as due to corporate matching diminishing). In light of this (no surplus to spend/decrease in income), the new budget reflects a decrease in amounts budgeted as well as a request to increase contribution amount by \$50. This increase is the first in many years.
- Additional income will be looked to be garnered by doing a better job of alerting folks who have not contributed (current contribution rate is around 80%).
- While there are cuts (like in surplus fund requests) we are still spending more than we have in the past. We have also

- added a line item for the surplus to keep it at a certain level.
- Changes to the budget include: removal of the bus transportation; Friday special amounts were decreased to match previous year's; academics and other items reduced to match actual expenditures; Older's Nature's Classroom is a big increase due to PTSA no longer covering any of it since Outdoor Ed is no longer a part of Sandburg's curriculum (longer discussion on this topic what it is, costs, and dues collection); some items reduced due to one year increases to cover two grades graduating. This resulted in a finished budget of about \$700 surplus rather than a \$15,000 deficit (had all expenses remained the same).
- Motion by Salmon/Jill to accept the 2012 2013 budget as presented passed unanimously.
